

Ege Carpets obtain international seal of quality for climate plan

Ege Carpets' climate plan has been approved by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi). With the approval, the Danish carpet giant documents that it sets ambitious climate targets in line with the latest climate research.

Carpet giant Ege Carpets has had its overall target for lowering the company's CO₂ emissions approved by the renowned and independent climate partnership Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi).

Rune Stephansen, CEO at Ege Carpets, is pleased with the approval as it's important for the company to take responsibility.

"For us, it's "a license to operate" our business that we cause the least possible nuisance to the environment. In recent years, we've been on a sustainability journey. The approval shows that there's action behind our words," says Rune Stephansen.

Ege Carpets' climate plan includes a commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 50.6% in scope 1 and 2 by 2030.

The plan classifies the carpet manufacturer within the most ambitious objective within SBTi and is in line with the requirement to limit the maximum temperature increase to 1.5 degrees, which is part of the Paris Agreement.



In addition, Ege Carpets are committed to a 27.5% reduction in scope 3 on purchased goods, services and final processing of sold products.

The approval obliges Ege Carpets to let everyone see the company's climate goals.

“The SBTi stamp also gives us the opportunity to demonstrate to our customers, employees and partners that we’re ambitious and that we want to be transparent, which fits well with us and what we stand for,” says Rune Stephansen. Ege Carpets share the SBTi label with Danish companies such as Novo Nordisk, Vestas and A.P. Møller-Mærsk.
